The first item on the agenda was approval of the agenda. It was moved by Wikner, seconded by Schildroth to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Next was to review and consider approval of the minutes for the May 16, 2024 meeting. It was moved by Schildroth, seconded by Wikner to approve the minutes as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Next was Discussion Items:

1. Review the draft FY 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and discuss the upcoming public input meetings

Durant said the draft document was submitted to the lowa DOT for comments. The document has also been published online. Each jurisdiction is strongly encouraged to review their projects for accuracy. Public input meetings will be held on Tuesday, June 25 from 12:00-1:00 PM at INRCOG, and Thursday, June 27 from 4:00-5:00 PM virtually. The final document will be brought to the Policy Board for consideration of approval at the July meeting.

2. Project Updates (TASA/TAP and STBG)

Bremer County

Moore said bridge projects are ongoing.

Butler County

Riherd said bridge projects are underway. Grading and restoration activities are to be

completed this summer.

Black Hawk County

Nicholas said paving is underway on Dunkerton Road. Deck work is completed, and painting is next for the federal aid bridge project on C57. The county is awaiting a permit for a bridge replacement project this summer.

Buchanan County

Keierleber said a railcar bridge is under construction. The Taylor's Ford Bridge TAP project is set to be let in October. W35 has cultural resources cleared with an environmental concurrence and right of way acquisition expected.

Grundy County

Mauer said the STBG project on D67 finished rock shouldering for a total of 12 miles. Wide lines remain to be finished.

In general discussion, Durant said staff is putting together a State Recreational Trail application to pave 3.1 miles of the Pioneer Trail west of the City of Reinbeck. The project would provide users with a separate paved trail from the existing Pioneer Trail to Reinbeck. Completion of the trail would enhance safety and leave Grundy County with one remaining trail gap. The application is due July 1st. Durant said the project is supported by the 2045 Long Range Plan's planned network and asked the group for a letter of support, to which the group agreed. Keierleber noted that the number of employees at the lowa DOT has impacted project development. If workload exceeds the number of employees, the lowa DOT may have to limit administering excessive projects.

There being no further business, Hildebrandt declared the meeting adjourned at 1:21 PM.
